3	the Industrial Development Agency. It is
4	Wednesday, February 10th. It is now 10:20.
5	Minutes of our meeting of January 20th
6	have been sent to everyone. I'll take a
7	motion to accept those.
8	MR. GRUCCI: So moved.
9	MR. BRAUN: Second?
10	MR. POLLAKUSKY: Seconded.
11	MR. BRAUN: These were transcribed, so
12	they are what they are, but are there any
13	questions or clarifications that need to be
14	made?
15	(No response.)
16	MR. BRAUN: Hearing none, we'll call a
17	vote.
18	Mr. Grucci?
19	MR. GRUCCI: Yes.
20	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Callahan?
21	MR. CALLAHAN: Yes.
22	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Pollakusky?
23	MR. POLLAKUSKY: Yes.

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2	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Braun votes yes.

4	I'll turn it over to Lori for the CFO
5	report.
6	MS. LaPONTE: Okay.
7	As far as the January results, I don't
8	have the financials currently yet, we're
9	working on them, so there's nothing to report
10	there.
11	Our audit of 12/31 information has been
12	completed, we're awaiting drafts of the
13	financial statements. Most of, if not all of
14	the information has been entered into PARIS,
15	so, again, once we get those final financials,
16	we can wrap up this process and we'll have
17	committee meetings where board and everyone
18	will review the drafts and the only other
19	thing I want to mention is just that we've
20	been disbursing all the PILOT's and
21	everything's timely.
22	Any questions?
23	MR. BRAUN: Lori, as long as you
2 4	mentioned PILOT's or Joce, anybody delinquent?

MS. LINSE: We have one that's an issue

2	that their check bounced, but other than that,
3	all are in.
4	MR. BRAUN: Who was that?
5	MS. LINSE: Regent Tek.
6	MS. MULLIGAN: We asked the bank to
7	redeposit the check, attempt it and it was
8	late in the first place, so penalties and
9	interest and a late fee invoice has gone out.
10	MR. BRAUN: Unless things have changed,
11	they usually will redeposit it the second
12	time, they will not do it a third time, you
13	can enter it for collection, but hopefully it
14	will be resolved before then.
15	MS. MULLIGAN: That's exactly what she
16	told us, they would do it more one more time
17	and that was it and there's no fee to us for a
18	bounced check.
19	MR. BRAUN: Okay.
20	MR. GRUCCI: Is this the first time
21	that this company has been delinquent like
22	this?
23	MS. MULLIGAN: No.
2 4	MR. TROTTA: When you called them, what

was their reaction?

2	MS. MULLIGAN: We naven't called them
3	yet because we wanted to see if it redeposits;
4	it's always possible that they moved money,
5	you know, timing wasn't right, so we're going
6	to give them another chance, although we did
7	send them the invoice that it was late, so
8	there's penalties and interest.
9	Joce, did she respond to you yet?
10	MS. LINSE: No, she hasn't.
11	MS. MULLIGAN: Okay.
12	MR. GRUCCI: When you say it's not the
13	first time, is this something that is creating
14	a problem that we need to take further action
15	on?
16	MS. MULLIGAN: Well this has
17	been I think this is the third year that
18	they've been in the PILOT program and they
19	have been late with their first half payment I
20	think every year or was last year their second
21	half payment? There's been an issue every
22	year.
23	MR. GRUCCI: Is this company in
24	trouble?
25	MR. BRAUN: Felix, we don't get current

2	financial statements, it's hard to tell.
3	I'm somewhat surprised that under
4	COVID, that this is the only one that is late
5	or that has bounced a check.
6	MS. MULLIGAN: Yeah.
7	MR. GRUCCI: Okay. Well, I would
8	suggest that we keep an eye on it and if
9	there's some other further action that's
10	needed, you know, Fred, you'll let us know?
11	MR. BRAUN: Yes.
12	MR. GRUCCI: Thank you.
13	MR. TROTTA: What happens if it does
14	bounce again?
15	MS. MULLIGAN: Well, we'll go back to
16	them and send them an updated invoice.
17	The check bounced, so they'll owe their
18	first half plus penalties and interest and
19	each month the penalties and interest increase
20	one percent going forward, it will increase
21	one percent and so I guess your question is
22	what if they just don't respond or if that's
23	the case, we can terminate them and put them
24	back on the tax rolls and then the assessor's

office can recoup the full taxation that was

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2	due and make everybody whole.
3	MR. TROTTA: Got you.
4	MS. MULLIGAN: It will be late,
5	everyone will be late in getting their taxes,
6	in theory and if they don't respond to that,
7	then it will go to the County just like if any
8	of us didn't pay our taxes.
9	MR. TROTTA: Right, okay.
10	When was that redeposited?
11	MS. MULLIGAN: Yesterday.
12	MR. TROTTA: Do you think we ought to
13	make a call over there and say hey, we
14	redeposited it?
15	MS. MULLIGAN: We've reached out, we're
16	not getting any traction. We'll certainly try
17	again.
18	MR. TROTTA: Okay. So none of this
19	sounds good.
20	MS. MULLIGAN: This is not atypical,

15	to our UTEP?
16	MS. MULLIGAN: Yes, all of these
17	projects do and I didn't say this about Sun
18	River, but they Sun River and Middle
19	Country Meadows also follow our requirement of
20	affordable and workforce housing components.
21	MR. GRUCCI: So there's not a need for
22	me to ask this question continuously, would
23	the application ever get to us if it didn't
2 4	conform to our UTEP?
2.5	MS. MULLIGAN: We certainly could get

2	an application that doesn't conform, but it
3	wouldn't get to a final authorizing
4	resolution.
5	MR. GRUCCI: Right. It wouldn't come
6	to the board if it didn't conform.
7	MR. WEIR: Unless you approve it as a
8	deviation.
9	MR. GRUCCI: Okay.
10	MR. BRAUN: Which would be so noted.
11	MR. WEIR: Yeah. An application could
12	come in that's not in conformity with the
13	UTEP. You would have to consider it as a
14	deviation looking at all the facts and
15	circumstances. However, this project is not a
16	deviation.
17	MR. GRUCCI: Got it. Thank you.

13	facilities. They have 72 employees and
1 4	they're currently in two facilities, one in
15	Nesconset and one in Port Jeff Station. They
16	lease those facilities, but the facility in
17	Port Jefferson they lease from themselves,
18	from a related entity. They are going to add
19	ten more employees as a result of this move
20	and they plan to lease about 10,000 square
21	feet to a third party.

21	going to remain in the facility and it is an
22	\$89 million project.
23	Bill, do you want to fill in the gap?
2.4	MR. WEIR: Yeah.

So there's really two parts of this.

Today's actually approving the application as well as approving the transfer of the ownership of the property or the lease of the property.

This is one of the last deals that the IDA actually is the fee owner of the property, so the IDA's in fee title. It's being leased currently to LAX Hotel, LLC and their rights under that lease and the PILOT and the other documents, which will then amend and restate. So we can approve them.

Now we are going to hold a public hearing for this and they also have requested mortgage recording tax exemption on a mortgage in an amount not to exceed 75 million, it will probably come in a little bit less than that and that also will be covered in the public hearing, so we'll be back in March, the March board meeting, to approve the granting of the mortgage recording tax exemption and the execution delivery of that mortgage, so you'll see this again next month, but right now, just accepting the application, we are approving the transfer from LAX Hotel to NM AMNL, LLC

1 2 and I think we should also adopt a resolution saying all applicants must have a name you can 4 pronounce. 5 MR. GRUCCI: Bill, I think I might have 6 missed it, but does this have any effect on the PILOT payments? 8 MR. WEIR: So there's several years 9 left on the PILOT. They are assuming the 10 obligation under the existing PILOT, we have not been asked to extend the PILOT. 11 12 MR. GRUCCI: Okay. And there's no 13 reduction in the PILOT payment? MR. WEIR: No, no, absolutely no 14 15 reduction in the PILOT, whatever is owed and 16 you know, those PILOT's payments really flow 17 to the benefit of Amneal, who's been paying 18 them, so . . . 19 MR. MS. SCHEIDT: Yes.

MR. BRAUN: Mr. Trotta?

MR. TROTTA: Yes.

MR. BRAUN: Mr. Braun votes yes.

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2	Motion carries.
3	MS. MULLIGAN: Thank you.
4	The next item on the agenda is the AE
5	Cassel project. This is a final authorizing
6	resolution.
7	Just to remind everyone, this is a \$4.4
8	million battery storage project at the Town's
9	Cassel facility on North Ocean Avenue in
10	Patchogue. We had a public hearing the other
11	day and there was no comment.
12	Does anyone have any questions; I've
13	actually learned a decent amount about battery
14	storage, it's interesting?
15	MR. TROTTA: Anything you want to
16	share?
17	MS. MULLIGAN: Just that there's
18	typically we've been dealing with power
19	purchase agreements and so it's a little bit
20	different, there's a program called BDR I
21	think is how you say it.
22	MS. EADERESTO: BDR, yup.
23	MS. MULLIGAN: So they're able to
24	extract energy from the grid, hold it and then

when there's a peak need, I think they have to

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have 48 hours, there's some notice involved in it, but they can then -- LIPA can then pull the energy out of the battery and then the company has a period of time where they have to grab power back into it when it's a low peak time, so they're then poised and ready to help in a peak moment again.

MS. EADERESTO: Why this works well with solar is obvious; when the sun is warmer, especially in the northeast and the days are longer, it produces more energy, so you pull it off the grid and you store it and how these companies get paid is in credits and what actually we're negotiating right now with this deal is the County's going to buy their credits -- the Town would buy their credits for 90 cents on the dollar, so they get credits off electric bills for this from LIPA and we would buy them from Agilitas for 90 cents, so we would have a ten cents savings, so if our bill for this building, for instance, is a hundred thousand dollars and we bought credits from them at 90 percent, 90 cents on the dollar, whatever those credits

2	were, we would get, let's say they had a
3	thousand dollars worth of credits, we would
4	pay 900, but we would pay the LIPA bill with a
5	thousand dollars of credits and it comes right
6	off our bill and we would only pay them we
7	would save ten percent. So we're negotiating
8	that right now. It's really a win-win and
9	you're going to see more of these, we're
10	working on some other ones.
11	MR. GRUCCI: How big is this battery?
12	MS. EADERESTO: It's about the size of
13	a Cassone trailer.
14	MR. GRUCCI: Okay.
15	MS. EADERESTO: So there's actually
16	going to be two at Cassel.
17	MR. BRAUN: Annette, does the Town own
18	that property or lease it?
19	MS. EADERESTO: We own it,
20	unfortunately. It was something we really
21	didn't need to buy, it's when they were
22	expanding their empire under the democrats.
23	MS. MULLIGAN: I remember.
24	Just to point out to everyone since it
25	is on Town property, this is a zeroed out

2	PILOT for 20 years.
3	MR. GRUCCI: Annette, this is a
4	question for you.
5	Is there any environmental hazard with
6	this battery and the storage of it?
7	MS. EADERESTO: Not at all. It's the
8	size of a Cassone trailer, they can actually
9	stack them one on top of another, too and it's
10	just like having a battery there, you know.
11	MR. GRUCCI: My experience with
12	batteries is when they leak, there's a mess.
13	MS. EADERESTO: Yeah, but it's all
14	enclosed, so it's not like if it leaks,
15	it's going to leak in that plastic enclosure.
16	MR. GRUCCI: Okay.
17	MS. EADERESTO: And it's on slabs and
18	everything else. The site plan's going
19	through administrative review of planning.
20	MR. GRUCCI: Got it. Thank you.
21	MS. EADERESTO: There's a little bit of
22	wetlands on that site, so we just have to be
23	careful because the headwaters of the river
24	are over there.
25	MR. WEIR: As Annette said, Felix, they

build these on a slab, like a curb surrounding it, so then if there's leakage or if there was a fire and they had to spray it with foam, it all will be contained, it won't be going into the ground.

MR. GRUCCI: Thank you.

MR. WEIR: But these will become more common as more solar and more wind power come on, you really need these for at night when there's no solar and when there's no wind, so they kind of are the back-ups for those renewable energy sources.

MS. SCHEIDT: It sounds like an easy process, you need it, you take it out, you can put it back in so it's there for the future, but my colleagues in the energy center have pointed out that it's really -- it's tricky to make sure that you don't plug in the power to the grid at the wrong voltage or a whole bunch of other things that I don't understand.

We are doing some work for the Navy right now on this and we have, thanks to Lisa, we've reached out to Agilitas to see whether there are needs that they will have in the

2	future, as Bill just said, there are more of
3	these things going in that we can help them
4	out with, so we want it to continue to be a
5	win-win.

MR. GRUCCI: Is this project strictly for governmental use or do they also sell these credits to the general public?

(No response.)

MS. MULLIGAN: I'm not sure if Annette heard you, but they reached out to me and just asked if the Town would be interested. I suspect that the credits are so much that it's not realistic for a resident to purchase, but, Annette.

MS. EADERESTO: You need to off-load these on somebody who has . . . basically what you need is a big user for . . . it could work that way. There's another program that's FIT V, which there's a two megawatt -- Lisa, you know about this -- they wanted to put it on the Szuster Farm in the Carmans River, so, you know, that was a big no, but we're trying to relocate that somewhere and it's a two megawatt and that one will feed in to low and

2	moderate income families and they will get the
3	benefit of that. So there's different
4	programs.
5	This particular one is not in that
6	program, this I think is FIT III, but there is
7	on FIT V that there's a program just for that
8	and Con Ed's also looking for Town property to
9	do the same kind of thing, put battery
10	storage, so you're going to see a lot of
11	these, guys, get used to them.
12	MR. BRAUN: If there are no other
13	questions, just remind everybody I need a
14	motion for a final authorizing resolution for
15	AE Cassel.
16	MR. TROTTA: Motion.
17	MS. SCHEIDT: Second.

19	as the members of the LLC and they get the tax
20	credits.
21	MS. EADERESTO: So you won't need
22	another closing.

24	MS. EADERESTO: Right.

19	reimburse us for our time spent on those items
20	so and I apologize what we're doing is
21	we added a line onto our time sheets, so when
22	somebody does something that falls under those
23	Economic Development responsibilities, we're
24	just noting it and then I guess monthly or

quarterly we will be sending, depending on the

2	workload, we'll be sending the Town our
3	invoice for reimbursement. So I just wanted
1	to make sure that you were aware that we will
ō	continue to take care of those items and the
ó	Town will be reimbursing us for it.

MR. BRAUN: We had originally suggested that they offset a portion of our rent, but for accounting reasons or whatever, we'll pay the full rent and they'll pay us on an hourly basis for whatever we do for the Town in Economic Development.

MR. GRUCCI: Do we have an hourly fee that we're going to submit or do we have to do a computation every time somebody works on something?

MS. MULLIGAN: No, Lori did, she did a very robust analysis of everybody's all-in costs and we came up with an average of a hundred dollars an hour, which we discussed I think at the last meeting.

I spoke to the Town about possibly adjusting that and didn't get much traction, but then I've gone back to Lori and we went through everything again and I do think that

2	that's a strong, reasonable number for us and
3	Lori, I don't know if you wanted to add to
4	that.
5	MS. LaPONTE: I think the number covers
6	every possible cost that an employee has, so I
7	think it's a fair
8	MR. GRUCCI: Do we have an
9	administrative cost in that hundred dollars or
10	is it just strictly time and benefits for the
11	employee?
12	MS. LaPONTE: Strictly time and
13	benefits. Because most of us do our own
14	administrative, like typing our own emails or
15	letters or things like that, so there's not
16	usually much involvement, but if there is an
17	admin person that's working on a project, they
18	also would charge that hundred dollars. So
19	that's how we would make it.
20	MR. GRUCCI: Okay.
21	MS. MULLIGAN: Okay.
22	So I just wanted to give a heads-up
23	just so that you were aware of work flow and
24	responsibilities and how things were flowing
2.5	and progressing in the office.

The next item on the agenda, a special meeting. I just really wanted to remind everybody that we have a brief meeting scheduled for next Wednesday. As it stands right now, we have one authorizing resolution and a request to extend sales tax, so I don't expect that it's going to be a very long meeting, it's possible that we could get a few other things in there between now and then, but for the most part I just wanted to remind everyone about that.

Also, I know Lori mentioned this, but I wanted to just point out that we are going to try to schedule an audit committee meeting in advance of our March 24th meeting to give the audit committee time to review the audit, so Frank and Marty, you guys are excluded from that, sorry or maybe you're welcome, I don't know. So I just wanted to mention that.

As soon as we get a draft, we're going to -- or we get confirmation that we will have a draft, we will work on scheduling that and that again, should be a pretty brief meeting, but we're trying to clean up our systems a

2	little	bit	with	our	committee	meetings,	which
3	brings	me	to an	other	thing.		

We're going to work on scheduling a calendar for the entire year and prescheduling our committee meeting so that every August we have a finance committee meeting so that we can just sort of get in the rhythm of having these committee meetings a little more formally, which we should be doing, so --

MR. BRAUN: Lisa, would that be joint committee meetings for the IDA and LDC?

MS. MULLIGAN: If appropriate.

What I'm thinking -- we're playing with it, but what I'm thinking is let's say every -- so our budgets are due to the state in the end of October -- thanks, Lori, she's nodding -- so what I was thinking is if we had a budget committee -- I'm sorry, a finance committee meeting in let's say August, that would give the committee time to review a budget that's put together and then it will give us time to have it to the full board -- and maybe August doesn't make sense, maybe it should be September, but whatever -- to have

it to the board in let's say October, but if it was something that only applies to the IDA, doesn't apply to the LDC, then I don't think we would have to have a meeting and we could always say listen, every November we review our fees or something, so we have a finance committee meeting, but we don't feel it's necessary right now.

So it's flexible, but I'm trying to get us into the rhythm of having these committee meetings . . . oh, we just have somebody joining, she's so sweet. Sorry, she just totally threw me off. I'll get focused, sorry, but she is just so adorable -- so I'm just going to try to get us having these meetings at least twice, twice a year for each committee and Lori, a lot of this falls on her because we have finance and the audit committee and governance, but finance and audit, Lori, you can nod.

MS. LaPONTE: We'll make it. I mean I think it's a good process just to be in the same, so we have it if anybody asks, we've had these meetings. They'll be brief.

2	MS. MULLIGAN: Yeah. Okay.
3	So does anyone have any questions?
