GROSS: Yeah, I thought that when they had changed how many people they're going to have in their facility and how many they could have in their facility, I thought they were going to have it by the end of this year, but they explained to us that the nature of the employees that they hire, their skill sets, is not so easy to fulfill.

13	that we can have two going at the same time
14	because according to IT, there's no way to
15	hold two Zooms at the same time with the
16	package that we have; I thought we got the
17	biggest and best, but maybe I misunderstood.
