2	MR. BRAUN: Next order of business is
3	we will open the Finance Committee meeting for
4	the Industrial Development Agency. We do have
5	a quorum. It is 11:22.
6	Lori, you're on.
7	MS. LaPONTE: Included in the package
8	is a budget for the month of March that I want
9	to discuss amending it.
10	This budget was set forth, I don't
11	know, Lisa, if you could throw it up there.
12	MS. MULLIGAN: Yup, I'm working on it.
13	MS. LaPONTE: Okay.
14	So this budget was based initially on
15	the old cost structure with still some of the
16	employees were working for the Town, some of
17	the employees were working for the IDA, so
18	this budget amendment, the biggest chunk of
19	it, is moving all of those costs into the
20	IDA's books. Also so that's the biggest
21	impact, that second column there, impact of
22	the Town cost move.
23	So next to it is the column for the
24	costs that we looked at that could be
25	allocated to the LDC, so that's reflected

3 As far as the changes to revenue and application fees and administration fees, this 4 is an estimate based on information we have. 5 6 We are ahead of what we originally budgeted at 7 this point, so there is some sense to doing 8 this adjustment. 9 The net effect of all these budget 10 changes is a balanced budget, meaning zero at 11 the end, which is what you strive for. 12 Is there any questions on any of the 13 information presented? MR. GRUCCI: On the proposed allocation 14 15 to the LDC, is that something that we have to 16 do or is it a discretionary move on behalf of 17 either management or the board? 18 MR. BRAUN: Felix, it's the other side 19 of the coin of the expenses you saw picked up by the LDC in our earlier meeting. 20 21 MR. GRUCCI: Yeah, that's . . . this is the funding vehicle for those expenses, is 22 23 that what you're saying? 24 MS. LaPONTE: Yes, yes. We've reduced 25 the expenses to move them on the LDC. In the

past, LDC has not had rent or any of these 2 costs in the past, so this was to give some 3 relief to the IDA. 4 5 MR. GRUCCI: I misunderstood, I had it 6 reversed, I thought LDC was reimbursing the 7 IDA, but it's the other way around. MR. BRAUN: It's not reimbursing, it's 8 9 just reallocation. 10 MR. GRUCCI: Correct. Whatever the 11 correct verbiage is, this money is moving from 12 IDA to LDC, not vice versa, it's not moving from LDC to IDA. 13 14 MS. LaPONTE: Right, right. 15 These expenses, like, for example, the 16 rent, a hundred percent of the rent was 17 included in the initial IDA budget. When we looked closer at it, it is determined that the 18 19 LDC obviously uses some space here, so we've 20 reduced rent expense on the IDA's books and 21 we've increased rent expense on the LDC books. MR. GRUCCI: I got it. 22 23 MS. LaPONTE: Okay. Sorry, I'm sorry 24 if I wasn't clear. 25 MR. GRUCCI: No, no, it was my mistake.

1 2 MS. LaPONTE: Okay. 3 MR. GRUCCI: The reason why I was asking the question was is because the LDC's 4 5 going to run in the negative and I thought the 6 money was coming from LDC to IDA. If we 7 stopped that money, then perhaps the LDC 8 wouldn't be in the red, but it's not that way, 9 it's the other way around, it's the IDA 10 reallocating funds to the LDC. 11 MR. BRAUN: Reallocating expenses. 12 MR. GRUCCI: Expenses, I'm sorry. 13 MR. BRAUN: Yes. 14 MR. GRUCCI: I'll get it yet, Fred. 15 MR. BRAUN: That's all right. 16 MR. GRUCCI: This getting old stuff isn't what it was cracked up to be. 17 18 MS. LaPONTE: And this is our first 19 time having to do something like this, also, 20 so . . . 21 MR. BRAUN: And I think the million 22 three in revenues is probably a realistic 23 number. I mean for the first -- and Lori will 24 talk about it in a minute -- for the first 25 three months it's almost 850,000 in revenue

2 and we have the big power project coming on 3 board as well as at least one fuel cell, perhaps two fuel cells and Bill, if AOE ever 4 5 closes, we'll have a big celebration. 6 MR. TROTTA: The way I look at all of 7 this, thank goodness we're able to do it all 8 and everything stays intact, you know. 9 MR. BRAUN: Right. 10 MR. TROTTA: We're in good shape that 11 way, so thank God it all worked together. No 12 disruption. 13 MR. BRAUN: We need a motion to accept 14 the amended budget and a recommendation to the 15 full committee. 16 MR. TROTTA: First. 17 MR. POLLAKUSKY: So moved. 18 MR. BRAUN: Mr. Callahan? 19 MR. CALLAHAN: Yes. 20 MR. BRAUN: Mr. Grucci? 21 MR. GRUCCI: Yes. 22 MR. BRAUN: Mr. Pollakusky? 23 MR. POLLAKUSKY: Yes. 24 MR. BRAUN: Ms. Scheidt?
