After the meeting had been duly called to order, the Chairman announced that among the purposes of the meeting was to consider and take action on certain matters pertaining to acquisition of a leasehold interest in and title to a certain industrial development facility more particularly described below (Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC 2024 Facility) and the leasing of the facility to Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC.

Braun Pally Scheidt Trotta Grucci Rose RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BROOKHAVEN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPPING OF A CERTAIN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT FACILITY AND MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND DETERMINATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE FACILITY AND APPROVING THE FORM, SUBSTANCE AND EXECUTION OF RELATED DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, by Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as amended, and Chapter 358 of the Laws of 1970 of the State of New York, as amended from time to time (collectively, the "Act"), the Town of Brookhaven Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency"), was created with the authority and power among other things, to assist with the acquisition of certain industrial development projects as authorized by the Act; and

WHEREAS, Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, on behalf of itself and/or the principals of Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC and/or an entity formed or to be formed on behalf of any of the foregoing (collectively, the "Company"), has applied to the Agency, to enter into a transaction in which the Agency will assist in the acquisition of a leasehold interest in portions of 3 parcels of land totaling approximately 6.06 acres and located at 5276 Expressway Drive South and 178 Morris Avenue, New York (more particularly described as Suffolk County Tax Map No. 0200-729.00-02.00-001.000, 002.000 and 003.000) (collectively, the "Land"), the demolition of two (2) existing buildings totaling approximately 8,000 square feet located on the Land, and the construction and installation of an 110-megawatt ("MW") battery energy storage system ("BESS") on the Land (collectively, the "Improvements"), and the acquisition and installation of modular battery containers, and other equipment for the operation of the project including, but not limited to, bi-directional inverter and transformer skids, an on-site project substation and interconnection switchgear (the "Equipment"; and together with the Land and the Improvements, the "Facility"), which Facility will be subleased by the Agency to the Company and used by the Company as a battery energy storage system capable of charging from and discharging into the Long Island Power Authority ("LIPA") power grid (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Savion, LLC, a developer of solar and energy storage projects throughout the U.S., which is owned by Shell New Energies US LLC and which in turn is owned by Shell USA, Inc. Savion, LLC has entered into an agreement to sell the membership interests of the Company to East Point Energy, LLC, which is a wholly owned direct subsidiary of Equinor Wind US LLC, which is a wholly owned direct subsidiary of Equinor ASA; and

WHEREAS, the Company will acquire a leasehold interest on the Land and will sublease the Land to the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Agency will acquire a subleasehold interest in the Land and a leasehold interest in the Improvements pursuant to a certain Company Lease Agreement,

dated as of August 1, 2024, or such other date as the Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency and counsel to the Agency shall agree (the "**Company Lease**"), by and between the Company and the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Agency will acquire title to the Equipment pursuant to a certain Bill of Sale, dated the Closing Date (as defined in the hereinafter defined Lease Agreement) (the "**Bill of Sale**"), from the Company to the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Agency will sub-sublease the Land, sublease the Improvements and lease the Equipment to the Company pursuant to a certain Lease and Project Agreement, dated as of August 1, 2024 or such other date as the Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency and counsel to the Agency shall agree (the "Lease Agreement"), by and between the Agency and the Company; and

WHEREAS, as security for a loan or loans, the Agency and the Company will execute and deliver to a lender or lenders not yet determined (collectively, the "Lender"), a mortgage or mortgages (the "Mortgage"), and such other loan documents satisfactory to the Agency, upon advice of counsel, in both form and substance, as may be reasonably required by the Lender, to be dated a date to be determined, in connection with the financing, any refinancing or permanent financing of the costs of the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility (collectively, the "Loan Documents"); and

WHEREAS, the Agency contemplates that it will provide financial assistance to the Company in the form of: (i) exemptions from mortgage recording taxes for one or more mortgages securing an amount presently estimated to be \$166,225,492 but not to exceed \$170,000,000, corresponding to mortgage recording tax exemptions presently estimated to be \$1,246,691.19, but not to exceed \$1,275,000, in connection with the financing of the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility and any future financing, refinancing or permanent financing of the costs of the acquisition, construction and equipping of the facility (ii) exemptions from sales and use taxes in an approximate amount not to exceed \$17,921,186, in connection with the purchase or lease of equipment, building materials, services or other personal property with respect to the Facility, and (iii) abatement of real property taxes (as set forth in the PILOT Schedule attached as Exhibit C hereof); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the abatement of real property taxes as set forth in the PILOT Schedule on Exhibit C hereof, the current pro-rata allocation of PILOT payments to each affected tax jurisdiction in accordance with Section 858(15) of the Act and the estimated difference between the real property taxes on the Facility and the PILOT payments set forth on the PILOT Schedule on Exhibit C hereof are more fully described in the Cost Benefit Analysis ("**CBA**") developed by the Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 859-a(5)(b) of the Act, a copy of which CBA is attached hereto as Exhibit D; and

WHEREAS, the Agency's Uniform Tax Exemption Policy adopted June 20, 2012, as amended on October 15, 2014, September 20, 2017 and June 17, 2020 ("UTEP"), which such UTEP is annexed hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u>, provides for the granting of financial assistance by the Agency for energy storage projects pursuant to Section 7(D)(1)(1); and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes and empowers the Agency to promote, develop, encourage and assist projects such as the Facility and to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing (the "**Hearing**") was held on July 16, 2024, so that all persons with views in favor of or opposed to either the financial assistance contemplated by the Agency or the location or nature of the Facility, could be heard; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Hearing was given on July 5, 2024, and such notice (together with proof of publication), was substantially in the form annexed hereto as $\underline{\text{Exhibit } A}$; and

WHEREAS, the report of the Hearing is substantially in the form annexed hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has given due consideration to the application of the Company and to representations by the Company that the proposed Facility is either an inducement to the Company to maintain and expand the Facility in the Town of Brookhaven or is necessary to maintain the competitive position of the Company in its industry; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York (collectively, the "SEQR Act" or "SEQR"), the Agency constitutes a "State Agency"; and

WHEREAS, to aid the Agency in determining whether the Facility may have a significant effect upon the environment, the Company has prepared and submitted to the Agency an Environmental Assessment Form (the "EAF") and related documents (collectively, the "Questionnaire") with respect to the Facility, a copy of which is on file at the office of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Agency constitutes an "Involved Agency" (as defined in SEQR); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the procedures set forth in 6 NYCRR § 617.6(b)(3), the Town of Brookhaven Planning Department (the "**Lead Agency**"), appointed itself as Lead Agency and following a coordinated review, determined that the Facility would not have a significant impact on the environment, and adopted a Negative Declaration for the Facility pursuant to the provisions of SEQR; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a resolution, dated January 23, 2023, the Lead Agency determined that the Action in connection with the Facility (the "Action"), is an Unlisted Action for SEQR purposes; and

WHEREAS, this determination constitutes a negative declaration for purposes of SEQR; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has reviewed the Questionnaire and such other documents as the Agency felt it necessary or appropriate to examine to adequately review the proposed Action; and

WHEREAS, the Agency finds that the negative declaration of the Lead Agency accurately and adequately examines environmental issues presented by the Action; and

WHEREAS, the Company has agreed to indemnify the Agency against certain losses, claims, expenses, damages and liabilities that may arise in connection with the transaction contemplated by the sub-subleasing, subleasing and leasing of the Facility by the Agency to the Company.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Agency (a majority of the members thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. Based upon the Questionnaire prepared by the Company and reviewed by the Agency, and other representations and information furnished regarding the Facility, the Agency determines that the action relating to the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility in an "Unlisted" action, as that term is defined under SEQR. The Agency also determines that the Facility will not have a "significant effect" on the environment and, therefore, an environmental impact statement will not be prepared. This determination constitutes a negative declaration for purposes of SEQR. Notice of this determination shall be filed to the extent required by the applicable regulations under SEQR or as may be deemed advisable by the Chairman or the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency or counsel to the Agency. This determination constitutes a negative declaration for purposes of SEQR. The Agency hereby adopts the Lead Agency's negative declaration as its own negative declaration under SEQR.

<u>Section 2.</u> In connection with the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility the Agency has assessed all material information included in connection with the Company's application for financial assistance, including but not limited to, the cost-benefit analysis prepared by the Agency and such information has provided the Agency a reasonable basis for its decision to provide the financial assistance described herein to the Company and the Agency hereby finds and determines:

(a) By virtue of the Act, the Agency has been vested with all powers necessary and convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of the Act and to exercise all powers granted to it under the Act; and

(b) The Facility constitutes a "project", as such term is defined in the Act; and

(c) The acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility and the leasing of the Facility to the Company, will promote and maintain the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the citizens of Town of Brookhaven, and the State of New York and improve their standard of living and thereby serve the public purposes of the Act; and

(d) The acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility is reasonably necessary to induce the Company to maintain and expand its business operations in the State of New York; and

(e) Based upon the representations of the Company, the transactions contemplated by the Lease Agreement shall not result in the removal of any facility or plant if any Facility occupant(s) from one area of the State to another area of the State or in the abandonment of one or more facilities or plants of the Facility occupant(s) located within the State; and

(f) Based upon representations of the Company and counsel to the Company, the Facility conforms with the local zoning laws and planning regulations of the Town of Brookhaven, Suffolk County, and all regional and local land use plans for the area in which the Facility is located; and

(g) It is desirable and in the public interest for the Agency to sublease the Facility to the Company; and

(h) The Company Lease will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency subleases the Land and leases the Improvements from the Company; and

(i) The Lease Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency sub-subleases, subleases and leases the Facility to the Company, the Agency and the Company set forth the terms and conditions of their agreement regarding payments-in-lieu of taxes, the Company agrees to comply with all Environmental Laws (as defined therein) applicable to the Facility and will describe the circumstances in which the Agency may recapture some or all of the benefits granted to the Company.

(j) The Loan Documents to which the Agency is a party will be effective instruments whereby the Agency and the Company agree to secure the Loan made to the Company by the Lender.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Agency has assessed all material information included in connection with the Company's application for financial assistance, including but not limited to, the cost-benefit analysis prepared by the Agency and such information has provided the Agency a reasonable basis for its decision to provide the financial assistance described herein to the Company.

<u>Section 4.</u> In consequence of the foregoing, the Agency hereby determines to: (i) lease the Land and the Improvements from the Company pursuant to the Company Lease, (ii) execute, deliver and perform the Company Lease, (iii) lease and sublease the Facility to the Company pursuant to the Lease Agreement, (iv) execute, deliver and perform the Lease Agreement, (v) grant a mortgage on and security interest in and to the Facility pursuant to the Loan Documents, and (vi) execute and deliver the Mortgage, and (vii) execute, deliver and perform the Loan Documents to which the Agency is a party.

<u>Section 5.</u> The Agency is hereby authorized to acquire the real property and personal property described in <u>Exhibit A</u> and <u>Exhibit B</u>, respectively, to the Lease

Agreement, and to do all things necessary or appropriate for the accomplishment thereof, and all acts heretofore taken by the Agency with respect to such acquisition are hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.

The Agency hereby authorizes and approves the following economic Section 6. benefits to be granted to the Company in connection with the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility in the form of: (i) exemptions from mortgage recording taxes for one or more mortgages securing an amount presently estimated to be \$166,225,492, but not to exceed \$170,000,000, corresponding to mortgage recording tax exemptions presently estimated to be \$1,246,691.19, but not to exceed \$1,275,000, in connection with the financing of the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility and any future financing, refinancing or permanent financing of the costs of the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Facility (ii) exemptions from sales and use taxes in an approximate amount not to exceed \$17,921,186, in connection with the purchase or lease of equipment, building materials, services or other personal property with respect to the Facility, and (iii) abatement of real property taxes (as set forth in the PILOT Schedule attached as Exhibit C hereof, the current pro-rata allocation of PILOT payments to each affected tax jurisdiction in accordance with Section 858(15) of the Act and the estimated difference between the real property taxes on the Facility and the PILOT payments set forth on the PILOT Schedule on Exhibit C hereof are more fully described in the CBA developed by the Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 859-a(5)(b) of the Act, a copy of which CBA is attached hereto as Exhibit D.

Subject to the provisions of this resolution, the Company is herewith Section 7. and hereby appointed the agent of the Agency to acquire, construct and equip the Facility. The Company is hereby empowered to delegate its status as agent of the Agency to its agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, suppliers, vendors and such other parties as the Company may choose in order to acquire, construct and equip the Facility. The Agency hereby appoints the agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, vendors and suppliers of the Company as agents of the Agency solely for purposes of making sales or leases of goods, services and supplies to the Facility, and any such transaction between any agent, subagent, contractor, subcontractor, materialmen, vendor or supplier, and the Company, as agent of the Agency, shall be deemed to be on behalf of the Agency and for the benefit of the Facility. This agency appointment expressly excludes the purchase by the Company of any motor vehicles, including any cars, trucks, vans or buses which are licensed by the Department of Motor Vehicles for use on public highways or streets. The Company shall indemnify the Agency with respect to any transaction of any kind between and among the agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, vendors and/or suppliers and the Company, as agent of the Agency. The aforesaid appointment of the Company as agent of the Agency to acquire, construct and equip the Facility shall expire at the earlier of (a) the completion of such activities and improvements, (b) a date which the Agency designates, or (c) the date on which the Company has received exemptions from sales and use taxes in an amount not to exceed \$17,921,186 in connection with the purchase or lease of equipment, building materials, services or other personal property; provided however, such appointment may be extended at the discretion of the Agency, upon the written request of the Company if such activities and improvements are not completed by such time. The aforesaid appointment of the Company is subject to the

completion of the transaction and the execution of the documents contemplated by this resolution.

<u>Section 8.</u> The Company is hereby notified that it will be required to comply with Section 875 of the Act. The Company shall be required to agree to the terms of Section 875 pursuant to the Lease Agreement. The Company is further notified that the tax exemptions and abatements provided pursuant to the Act and the appointment of the Company as agent of the Agency pursuant to this Authorizing Resolution are subject to termination and recapture of benefits pursuant to Sections 859-a and 875 of the Act and the recapture provisions of the Lease Agreement.

<u>Section 9.</u> The form and substance of the Company Lease, the Lease Agreement and the Loan Documents to which the Agency is a party (each in substantially the forms presented to or approved by the Agency and which, prior to the execution and delivery thereof, may be redated and renamed) are hereby approved.

Section 10.

(a) The Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency or any member of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver the Company Lease, the Lease Agreement and the Loan Documents to which the Agency is a party, all in substantially the forms thereof presented to this meeting with such changes, variations, omissions and insertions as the Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency or any member of the Agency shall approve, and such other related documents as may be, in the judgment of the Chairman and counsel to the Agency, necessary or appropriate to effect the transactions contemplated by this resolution (hereinafter collectively called the "Agency Documents"). The execution thereof by the Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency or any member of the Agency by the Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency or any member of the chairman and counsel to the Agency.

(b) The Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer of the Agency or any member of the Agency are further hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to designate any additional Authorized Representatives of the Agency (as defined in and pursuant to the Lease Agreement).

Section 11. The officers, employees and agents of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency to do all acts and things required or provided for by the provisions of the Agency Documents, and to execute and deliver all such additional certificates, instruments and documents, pay all such fees, charges and expenses and to do all such further acts and things as may be necessary or, in the opinion of the officer, employee or agent acting, desirable and proper to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolution and to cause compliance by the Agency with all of the terms, covenants and provisions of the Agency Documents binding upon the Agency.

<u>Section 12.</u> Any expenses incurred by the Agency with respect to the Facility shall be paid by the Company. The Company agrees to pay such expenses and further agrees to indemnify the Agency, its members, directors, employees and agents and hold the Agency

and such persons harmless against claims for losses, damage or injury or any expenses or damages incurred as a result of action taken by or on behalf of the Agency in good faith with respect to the Facility.

<u>Section 13.</u> The provisions of this resolution shall continue to be effective for one year from the date hereof, whereupon the Agency may, at its option, terminate the effectiveness of this Resolution (except with respect to the matters contained in Section 12 hereof).

Section 14. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

<u>Section 1.</u> Lisa MG Mulligan, Chief Executive Officer of the Town of Brookhaven Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency") called the hearing to order.

<u>Section 2.</u> Lisa MG Mulligan then appointed herself the hearing officer of the Agency, to record the minutes of the hearing.

<u>Section 3.</u> The hearing officer then described the proposed transfer of the real estate, the other financial assistance proposed by the Agency and the location and nature of the Facility as follows:

Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, on behalf of itself and/or the principals of Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC and/or an entity formed or to be formed on behalf of any of the foregoing (collectively, the "Company"), has applied to the Agency, to enter into a transaction in which the Agency will assist in the acquisition of a leasehold interest in portions of 3 parcels of land totaling approximately 6.06 acres and located at 5276 Expressway Drive South and 178 Morris Avenue, New York (more particularly described as Suffolk County Tax Map No. 0200-729.00-02.00-001.000, 002.000 and 003.000) (collectively, the "Land"), the demolition of two (2) existing buildings totaling approximately 8,000 square feet located on the Land, and the construction and installation of an 110-megawatt ("MW") battery energy storage system ("BESS") on the Land (collectively, the "Improvements"), and the acquisition and installation of modular battery containers, and other equipment for the operation of the project including, but not limited to, bidirectional inverter and transformer skids, an on-site project substation and interconnection switchgear (the "Equipment"; and together with the Land and the Improvements, the "Facility"), which Facility will be subleased by the Agency to the Company and used by the Company as a battery energy storage system capable of charging from and discharging into the Long Island Power Authority ("LIPA") power grid (collectively, the "Project"). The Facility will be initially leased, owned, operated and/or managed by the Company.

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Savion, LLC, a developer of solar and energy storage projects throughout the U.S., which is owned by Shell New Energies US LLC and which in turn is owned by Shell USA, Inc. Savion, LLC has entered into an agreement to sell the membership interests of the Company to East Point Energy, LLC, which is a wholly owned direct subsidiary of Equinor Wind US LLC, which is a wholly owned direct subsidiary of Equinor ASA.

The Agency will acquire a subleasehold interest in the Land, a leasehold interest in the Improvements and title to or a leasehold interest in the Equipment and will sub-sublease, sublease and lease the Facility to the Company. The Agency contemplates that it will provide financial assistance to the Company in the form of exemptions from mortgage recording taxes in connection with the financing or any subsequent refinancing of the Facility, exemptions from sales and use taxes and abatement of real property taxes, consistent with the policies of the Agency.

<u>Section 4.</u> The hearing officer then opened the hearing for comments from the floor for or against the proposed transfer of real estate, the other financial assistance proposed by the Agency and the location and nature of the Facility. 

This is a follow up of our conversation on Dec 4, 2023. I appreciate you taking your time out of your busy schedule to answer some of my questions. Although some of our concerns might be out of the scope of this agency it's worth bringing this to your attention.

This letter is in regards to the construction of 110MW Lithium battery storage facility in Holtsville, Town of Brockhaven, Suffolk County NY. There are many concerns of constructing such a large magnitude facility at said location operating remotely. It is my understanding that the NYS Public Service Commission approved a site plan along with the Town of Brockhaven for such a facility based on a filed petition on March 12, 2023 by Holtsville Energy Storage LLC. These 3 parcels are currently owned by Lawlor Venture LLC, and Lucretis Fierro with the intended sites to be purchased by privately owned company known as Savion

I am opposed to such a facility with this magnitude for the following reasons. This site could be a prime target for a soft cell terrorist attack. There is also nothing in place to prevent a flyover of drone(s)s in this restricted area. If one attack happens, our Fire, Police, and Medical Services are not equipped to handle such a catastrophic event. This also puts our Sachem school students at risk of exposure to toxic gasses known as Phosphoryl Fluoride (BOF3) and Hydrogen Fluoride (HF) There are 4 Schools estimated to be within a mile radius or less of this proposed approved site. In addition there is the Island 16 movie theater, Residence Inn facility, Chilis, Wendys, Cajun Seafood, On the Border, Morris Ave Industrial Park, Town of Brookhaven Morris Ave Park, Top Golf, Gulf Gas Station along with local residents all in very close proximity. This site also brings concerns as it is very close to the Long Island Expressway, Nichols Road, and the Long Island Railroad. thus making it almost impossible to do a safe evacuation in an emergency ultimately preventing reasonable access to Stony Brook Hospital. St Charles Hospital and Mather Hospital.. This lithium battery storage facility is also in the direct flight pattern from planes leaving and returning to MacArthur Airport. This area has already been overdeveloped with the Northville Terminal, NYS Robert Flynn Power Plant along with National Grid. In the immediate vicinity is a cell tower. This cell tower / antenna is a vital infrastructure to many law enforcement agencies and fire departments who rely on this for clear communications

A fire or explosion would have a detrimental effect at this lithium battery storage facility and would compromise our vital infrastructure putting our children, residents, fire fighters, and police in harm's way. There is no plan in place to provide a safe evacuation of school children in the area if a catastrophic event took place at this facility. A school lock down would be flawed and toxins could enter the school building through dampers.. Keeping in mind the local fire departments are all volunteers who do a great job, but are not professional firefighters thus placing them at risks. The ability to have the manpower of these Volunteer Firefighters available Is often a great challenge.

With the Savion Bess Lithium Storage Facility being given the needed approval to operate at the Morris Avenue location in Holtsville against the safety concerns of illness, injury, and or loss of life to the local residents could result in serious legal ramifications and at the same time drastically reduce the value of property. If the Suffolk County Government can get hacked, then this remote storage facility can get hacked too, putting all of us at risk. I understand that there is a small economic benefit of creating temporary jobs and some union workers have endorsed this project regardless of that it should never overstate our rights and safety concerns. The risk is greater than the benefits. We certainly don't want to see that BESS explosion and fire what happened in Warwick NY happen here on Long Island.

It should also be known that Steven Losquardo is an attorney representing the Savion Energy Storage Company, his brother is the Town of Brookhaven Highway Superintendent Dan Losquadro. I believe this could be a major conflict of interest, and could have easily persuaded and influenced other elected Town of Brookhaven members to seek a fastrak of approval for this site plan along with its recommendations to the PSC, thus tipping the scale for approval.

This L1 zoning on this site is listed as light industry, however we feel that this proposed BESS site is not compatible with current land usage in this vicinity, as it is overpopulated. Cooling fans of a BESS will generate noise at about 37 - 60 decibels. This would clearly be a non compliance noise issue to Chapter 50 of Brookhaven Town Code and NYS noise laws operating between the hours after 10pm and before 7am.

The Holtsville Energy Storage LLC misrepresented and falsely argued the point that this BESS Lithium Storage Facility was a necessity and is in the best interest of this community when seeking a variance and special permit from the Brookhaven Planning Board. listing the surrounding area as remote with light traffic, this is totally not true. An example of this deliberate misinformation was expressed in the Savion online meeting on Nov 20, 2023 Savion representatives emphasize extreme safety measures were in place. Savion wants people to believe that a fire hydrant in the area provides adequate safety when in reality it's irrelevant, because large lithium battery fires are not professionally extinguished with water making a fire hydrant in the area moot. Clearly a misrepresentation of facts and safety.

It is my assertion the Town of Brookhaven and the Public Service Commission acted on this inaccurate flawed information and made an error of judgment in approval of this site. Not taking in full consideration of the impact this lithium battery storage facility will have on our area. This misleading information on safety is disturbing. Inadequate notification from the town of Brookhaven generated a small number of people opposed to this BESS; this amount It has been recorded at 120 people by the Public Service Commision in your briefing. The real fact is there are now over 2,500 signatures on record in petitions opposing this Lithium Battery Storage Facility in Holtville on Morris Ave.

From my personal experience as a retired police lieutenant, certified police instructor, former member of a local volunteer fire department. Emergency Medical Technician, NIMS certified. along with many other training and experiences. I have petitioned the State of NY, Public Service Commission, Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk and all elected officials to say <u>NO</u> <u>TO THIS SITE</u> and removal of all permits, and approval in conjunction to operate and install this lithium battery storage facility DBA ``Savion" at this locations until further studies from Governor Hochul's "inter-Agency fire Safety Working Group" is executed in full force. In addition New York State Senator Alexis Weikl has also requested that this lithium Battery Storage Facility PSC approval be paused. In addition to Anthony Piccirillo, Suffolk County Legislator, and Doug Smith, NYS Assemblyman

I am petitioning the Brookhaven Industrial Development Agency to review the application of extension for Holtsville Energy Storage and Holtsville Solar LLC operating with Savion Energy. There are over 2,500 local residents and workers who oppose this facility. The need to re-evaluate the safety of this community and financial stability of this mega project moving forward. Our concerns are recorded in the public record. This site has not been planned out well and could easily cause *safety and financial hardship* to local businesses and residents. A pause on this site is warranted and our complaints need to be heard before the sale of this land and groundbreaking takes place. Your help in this matter would be greatly appreciated in protecting our school children and our local community. and enhancing the safety of all. 

Finding better energy solutions is important, but not when it threatens the residents and ecosystem of the towns of islip and Brookhaven


- This proposed facility is located within one mile of NINE (9) Sachem school buildings, and very close proximity to residential homes, local businesses, and youth sport facilities.

- The Sachem CSD has not been contacted by either Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC or any local, State, and/or federal agency to discuss and plan for any possible emergency nor how to prepare for such an emergency that would impact students, staff members, and parents.
- No volunteer Fire Department in the local area is equipped, resourced, and/or trained to respond to a fire or any other emergency at a battery energy storage system site.
- Lithium-ion batteries cause aggressive, uncontrollable fires that are extremely difficult to put out and can cause an explosion.
- Fire Extinguishers do not work on lithium-ion battery fires.
- Water may not prevent a battery from burning and spreading.
- Battery cells are known to explode and quickly spread to another battery.
- Lithium-ion batteries are known to unexpectedly re-ignite minutes, hours and even days after all visible fire has been put out.
- Lithium-ion batteries can enter an uncontrollable, self-heating state. This can result in the release of gas, particulates, and possible explosion.





Dear Hon. Michelle L. Phillips:

As duly elected officials, who also serve as members of the Energy Committees within the New York State Assembly and Suffolk County Legislature respectively, we urgently write to you to express our grave concerns regarding the proposed siting of an up to 110-megawatt (MW)-capacity, stand-alone battery energy storage system (BESS) facility with accompanying substation in the unincorporated Hamlet of Holtsville, Town of Brookhaven, Suffolk County, Long Island. If approved, Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC ("Holtsville"), would be authorized to develop, own, and operate said facility, capable of providing the local grid with frequency regulation, voltage control, and emergency backup power. "When discharging stored energy, it is anticipated the project will be capable of powering approximately 18,000 homes for approximately 4 hours."

At a virtual public statement hearing held on June 29th, 2023, ten members of the public offered their input primarily raising concerns about the location of the facility, given the population density of the community, and posing questions regarding safety and security. Many commenters expressed support for battery storage facilities generally but were opposed to this specific project due to its location in our community. One commenter fully supported the project.

We understand that safeguarding the spirit of innovation is a prerequisite to maintaining an adaptable, resilient society. Furthermore, maintaining open competition is also prudent in keeping with the free-market system underpinning our great nation. However, we believe it is too soon to attempt to proliferate facilities such as battery energy storage systems (or BESSs), as is arguably being done blindly in the matter at hand, a mere stone's throw from the following, no less: a

chemical and solvent distributor, various eateries, a church, a synagogue, a middle school, a movie theater, several hotels, a youth sports facility, and our Main Street business district. Worse yet, the facility would sit a block away from a cluster of homes, and, if one looks across the Long Island Expressway, more homes, a middle school, two elementary schools, a public library, another youth sports facility, and a gas station, to name a few.

Meanwhile, Holtsville asserts, in its Frequently Asked Questions document on BESSs via its website, "We chose the site on the southwest corner of Long Island Expressway and Morris Road to maximize benefits to the grid and ratepayers. It is directly adjacent to transmission lines, which means it will service energy users efficiently, and electricity will flow easily in and out of the grid when required. Additionally, the parcel location is within an area that is zoned for industrial facilities."

As of close of business on June 30th, 2023, fifty-six (56) public comments have been posted to the DPS Matter Master page¹ with all but one member of the public opposed to the project.

At least one commenter cites a nearby asphalt plant as already polluting the air, and that a BESS could further compound said air quality concerns. Notably, another individual writes: "I work in the battery business and I can assure you that should a battery storage plant this size catch on fire, the explosion could rock the buildings, crack foundations, break windows - within a 5 mile radius. If the local fire department is not equipped and thoroughly trained in these types of explosions, fires, thermal runaway - the disaster could be catastrophic."

Specifically, on approximately March 15th, 2023, Holtsville filed a petition with the Commission seeking an Order, respectively, (1) granting it a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) pursuant to § 68 of the Public Service Law, (2) approving a lightened regulatory regime consistent with previous Commission Orders involving exempt wholesale generators, and (3) for an expedited proceeding pursuant to 16 NYCRR § 21.10. Holtsville's principal place of business is in Lenexa, Johnson County, Kansas, and is incorporated in Delaware, and is a wholly owned project company of Savion, LLC (headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri), which, in turn, is owned by Shell.

Savion already has a total of 23 GW of solar and energy storage projects, located across 31 U.S. states, with 162 current projects in various phases.

The proposed project would be located at 5276 Expressway Drive South, Morris Avenue, and 178 Morris Avenue on three abutting parcels totaling 6.06 acres. More specifically, the proposed site is adjacent to industrial and commercial recreational uses in the L Industrial 1 Zoning District between the South Service Road of the Long Island Expressway, Long Island Avenue, Nicolls Road (CR 97), and the Long Island Power Authority right-of-way on approximately six acres of land within said District, and would come equipped with, among other components, 124 lithium-ion battery containers; heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) cooling systems; control instrumentation; and electric grid interconnection switchgear for the 138-kilovolt (kV)

interconnection, which provides switching and protection to the BESS's electrical systems and point of interconnection.

It is expected that the facility would reach the end of its useful life by the 25-year mark, or, alternatively, if storage and distribution of electricity has ceased or been abandoned for more than one year, then the facility will be decommissioned.

With respect to safety concerns, it bears noting that, after an 8-month-long construction period, this project is expected to operate 24/7/365 and would be at least remotely monitored around-the-clock and would be restricted to Holtsville personnel and authorized contractor crews. It is expected that routine facility and site maintenance requirements are performed during normal operation in non-dispatch hours (typically monthly) with service technicians coming on-site to inspect all equipment and to clean/replace/add battery modules on specific schedule milestones. However, it begs the question, will the facility essentially operate in a quasi-unsupervised matter most of the time?

Further, while it is fortunate that fire hydrants are within reach for first responder use, the availability thereof can be considered a meager preventative measure. Holtsville does include a Fire & Safety section, merely stating: "Lithium-ion cells rarely experience failure leading to fire, however modern codes and standards such as NFPA-855 and UL-9540a require several independent preventative features to be included to minimize the risk of fire. With all these features in place and fully operational, the likelihood of a fire is reduced even further. These features include a battery management system, remote monitoring, gas detection, ventilation, and in some installations, fire suppression" (in response to the hypothetical questions "What about thermal runaway and fires? What is the likelihood of a battery fire?"). It is unclear if the Holtsville Fire Department or any neighboring fire departments, comprised of local volunteers, have the equipment and resources to combat a fire or disaster at this facility.

To state that "Lithium-ion cells rarely experience failure leading to fire," is outdated or inaccurate. On May 31, a \$55 Million 5 MW lithium-ion BESS overheated and erupted in fire in East Hampton and could be offline for months. Reported by Newsday² on June 27, "According to a report³ by the American Public Power Association, a battery storage unit in Surprise, Arizona, experienced a "catastrophic failure" in 2019 that injured first responders. The 'extensive cascading thermal runaway event,' was caused by an internal cell failure."

There is simply a saturation of experimental technology out in society, the full spectrum of dangers only continues to grow clearer, little by little. It is of the utmost importance to respect land uses and respect local zoning laws, while also allowing breathing room for innovation and industry. However, more and more pressures are being applied to firefighters, EMS, and other emergency personnel who now must extinguish fires sparked by electric cars, school buses, scooters, and other electric modalities, and that is without even introducing a BESS into the community.

BESSs are, above all, susceptible to risk of explosion and fires. They can also emit smoke and toxic fumes in the form of gas containing fluorine compounds. This gas is susceptible to ignition, but even when it does not ignite, this gas still lingers in the air and can prompt permanent eye and lung damage.

It is ironic and almost unbalanced, to say the least, for Holtsville Energy Storage to pack its FAQ document solely with talking points such as "Energy storage will [...] help cut emissions as it takes more of the load off traditional fossil-fuel based generation."

The fluorine compounds are found in the class of "fluorinated gases" (F-gases), which are man-made, and used in industrial applications, two of which are hydrogen fluoride (HF) and phosphoryl fluoride (POF3). They're greenhouse gases with an even higher warming potential than that possessed by carbon dioxide. According to the federal Environmental Protection Agency, F-gases include the "most potent and longest-lasting greenhouse gases emitted by human activities."

Furthermore, Savion, LLC, in conjunction with Boralex, is already supposed to have another BESS in the works in the Town of Brookhaven, in the Hamlet of Yaphank, expected to possess 308 MWh of storage capacity, so it would be prudent to wait and see how this facility operates. That BESS is supposed to be paired with five Boralex upstate photovoltaic solar electricity generation projects, per a 2022 award by the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority.

Therefore, we urge a pause on a potential siting approval, pending further research on both the benefits and hazards of siting a BESS – especially one so near to residential homes and our local business district. We are concerned about the safety of the people of our community. We have one opportunity to get this process right, and we join our constituents in strongly opposing a lightened regulatory regime and expedited proceeding as has been requested in this instance.

It has recently come to my attention that you have launched a working group to inspect safety issues penaining to energy storage facility sites to ensure local communities can respond adequately in case of future incidents.

On October 12. 2023, at least three months after the creation of this working group, the State of New York Public Service Commission approved the petition of Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC for a Certificate of Necessity, granting a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and granting a Lightened Regulatory Regime and **expedited proceeding**. I find it extremely concerning for the Sachem School District, Holbrook and Holtsville Fire Departments, and residents in the neighborhoods surrounding this facility that instead of having their requested paused to hear findings from the working group, it was expedited!

Since your concerns warranted the launching of a working group of NYSERDA, NYS Department of State, and NYS Department of Homeland Security, how can this be justified? Why was this process expedited? What actions do you intend to take that will correct what we see as an erroneous action? All approval processes should have been placed on hold, awaiting the outcome of the findings of this working group. Concerns should include but should not be limited to fire safety risks in the storage of lithium-ion batteries.

The New York State Public Service Commission should not have approved this application with the completion and approval of the emergency plan for this facility. Even within their own document approving the facility, the Public Service Commission cites fire safety concerns.


In addition to the necessary agencies, this emergency plan preparation process must include all stakeholders, Suffolk County, Town of Brookhaven, Holbrook and Holtsville Fire Departments, and public hearings. The State of New York needs to not only ensure public safety, but also build public confidence in the process.

I urge you to pause the New York State Public Service Commission's approval of Holtsville Energy Storage, LLC petition until an emergency plan is approved by the stakeholders. Secondly, I ask you to task the working group to complete their report with recommendations in a timely fashion. That will provide an opportunity for the New York State Senate and Assembly to review the report and draft appropriate, necessary legislation in this upcoming session.

The residents of Holtsville, Holbrook and surrounding areas are deeply concerned and opposed to the proposed Holtsville Energy Storage Facility (Battery Energy Storage System) project on Morris Ave. This would be one of the largest facilities in the U.S. consisting of 110-megawatts, with 124 lithium-ion battery containers.

Consider the following:

- This does not belong in any residential area or near schools. This facility is proposed to sit within less than a one-mile radius of (9) NINE school buildings as well as homes and businesses.

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




